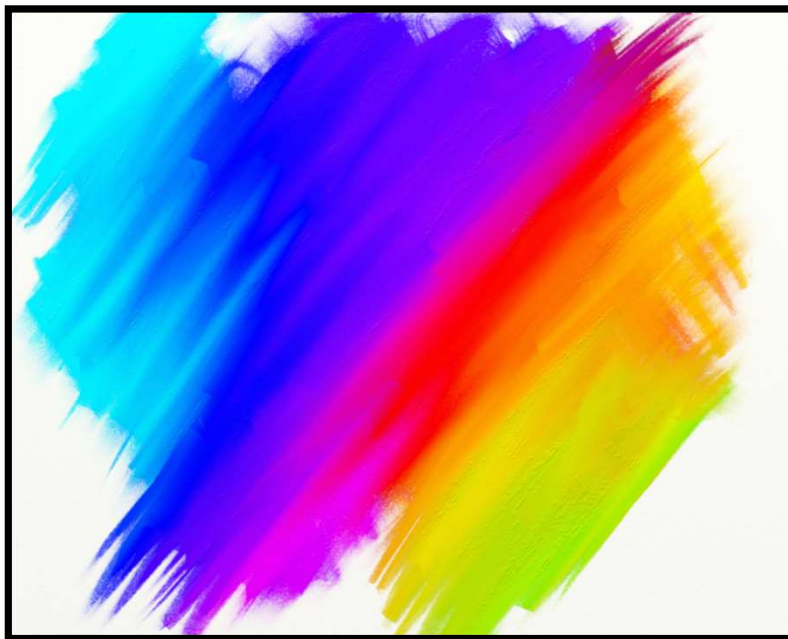

Portraiture Strand

Strand Intent

This strand provides children with the opportunity to consider the idea of identity (their own and others) as they grow and learn during their time at Courtwood. It links to the curriculum aim of developing responsible, confident young people who demonstrate tolerance and respect for others, and understand how to develop a sense of self, valuing others ideas, differences and contributions.

The Natural World Strand

Strand Intent

This strand ties into Courtwood's outdoor learning ethos and curriculum offer, by making links in a cross-curricular way to the great outdoors, ensuring children develop a growing knowledge of the outside world. This will include studying the work of painters, sculptors and crafts-people. It also aims to address local need – providing opportunities for our children to connect with nature, understand it better and become informed citizens, leading healthy and active lives. Children will have the opportunity to use the school grounds, including our woods and Edible Playground, in art lessons throughout the key stages.

World Art Strand

Strand Intent

This strand aims to support pupil's cultural, social and geographical understanding, including a country's heritage and arts history. It provides the opportunity to study native art and artists and develop an understanding of art across the world, thereby increasing pupil's cultural capital. We hope this understanding will ensure children are aware of cultures around the world and ensure they can be active, positive citizens in the local and wider community.
